

Heads Up!

It is Springtime and soon the mosquitoes will be buzzing. In fact some of them may have been living in your house all winter. The mosquito is the vector for spreading heartworm among dogs and cats.

You say, "I've been giving my dog heartworm preventative each month." Good for you, but are you aware that, like all vaccines, it can fail to protect in some rare instances? Also it could happen that your dog spit a dose out when you weren't looking.

If you haven't had your dog tested for heartworm for several years, we are recommending that you have this test done at least every two years.

Another reminder! Last winter was comparatively mild. Don't forget to protect your dogs against fleas and ticks.
