Dealing with Heartworm Disease at the Rescue

In earlier newsletters we have told you about dogs—Dusty, Bebe, Ben, and Max—that have come into the Rescue with severe injuries needing complicated surgeries and long term care. We have also told you about others that have come to us so malnourished and emaciated that they could barely stand on their own. In this issue we will tell you about an ongoing problem that the Rescue must deal with—heartworm disease.

Every dog that comes into the Rescue is tested for heartworm disease, and every year we have one or two that are heartworm positive and must be treated. This year has started off worse than usual. Three heartworm positive dogs have come into the Rescue. **Brent**, **Sasha**, and **Stanley** have different backgrounds, but they have one thing in common—their owners neglected to give the heartworm preventive.

Heartworm disease is fatal unless treated. The treatment is difficult, risky, and expensive. Treatment requires careful medical care and complete rest for five to six weeks. Treatment for large dogs can cost \$600 or more. The Summer Raffle is dedicated to raising funds to pay for treating these dogs plus any more that might need it.

Next Project Canine Infirmary



The treatment for heartworm disease in a dog is a risky business. It is extremely important that the dog be confined and not allowed any vigorous activity. Such activity causes the heart to pump faster, and bits of the dead heartworms can block pulmonary or coronary blood vessels. This can be fatal. An infirmary would make the post treatment care of such a patient a lot safer for the dog and much easier for the care giver.

In the Fall 2004 newsletter we reported that an RV had been donated to the Rescue to be converted into an infirmary. This will make it possible to quarantine new dogs until we are sure that they are healthy enough to be moved in with the other dogs. Dogs recovering from surgery will have a quiet place to recuperate. A separate space will make it easier and safer to treat a dog needing special care.

To convert the RV will require money and volunteer workers. The inside will have to be stripped of carpet and remodeled to provide space and storage for equipment and supplies. Water, gas and electricity will have to be connected, and it will need to be air-conditioned. Several colossal crates and Kuranda Dog Beds will be needed. A ramp will have to be built to make it easier to move a dog on a litter in and out.
