WATCH OUT FOR THE BUGS

With this record-breaking warm spring, experts predict a long and tough season in the fight against ticks, fleas, and mosquitos. Please be sure to keep your dogs on heartworm protection and act early and with vigilance to stay ahead of the fleas and ticks. Additionally, heartworm treatment drugs are in very short supply and may not be available when you need them. Prevention is key!

ABOUT THE RESCUE

HHGDR has operated as a Rescue since 1992. It became a registered 501(c)3 non-profit in 1998, and to date has placed 1,440 dogs in carefully screened "forever" homes. HHGDR serves Ohio, extreme northern Kentucky, and eastern Indiana. Currently 25 dogs are available for adoption. In addition, the Rescue houses Sanctuary Dogs living out their lives in the safe environment of the Rescue (the latter unadoptable for health,

age, or other conditions). In 2010 HHGDR spent nearly \$20,000 on vet bills alone. Contributions are always welcome and are tax-deductible.

Unlike some large nonprofits, HHGDR has no paid employees. Not one person receives financial compensation for the work done for the Rescue—the only pay is the gratification of helping the homeless dogs, as well as dog kisses and hugs!
