ABOUT THE RESCUE

HHGDR has operated as a volunteer-run Rescue since 1992. It became a registered 501(c)3 nonprofit in 1998, and to date has placed more than 1,500 dogs in carefully screened forever homes. HHGDR serves Ohio, extreme northern Kentucky, and parts of eastern Indiana. Currently 16 dogs are available for adoption. In addition, the Rescue houses Sanctuary Dogs living out their lives in the safe environment of the Rescue (the latter unadoptable for health, age, or other conditions). BORDETELLA AKA KENNEL COUGH: To Vaccinate or Not to Vaccinate?

Bordetella aka Kennel cough, is infectious canine tracheobronchitis, a very highly contagious respiratory disease among dogs. As the name of the disease suggests, it is typically the inflammation of the trachea and bronchi. This disease is found throughout the world and is known to infect a very high percentage of dogs at least once during their lifetime.

Young puppies can suffer the most severe complications that can result from this disease, since they have an underdeveloped immune system. Also at increased risk are older dogs, which have decreased immune capabilities, and pregnant females, which also have lowered immunity to infections.

Symptoms

- Dry hacking cough (most common)
- Cough that may sound like honking
- Retching
- Watery nasal discharge
- In mild cases dogs will likely be active and eating normally
- In severe cases symptoms progress and can include thick green mucus nasal discharge, pneumonia, loss of appetite, fever, lethargy, and even death

Some of the most common causes that contribute to the infectious canine tracheobronchitis disease are Bordetella bronchiseptica, parainfluenza virus, and mycoplasma, as well as canine herpes virus, reovirus, and the canine adenovirus can also cause this disease. Any one of these organisms can cause the symptoms of this disease, and in most of the cases the result of the disease is thought to be more than one organism combined.

However, the most common and important organism that causes tracheobronchitis is the parainfluenza virus. This par-

ticular virus causes gentle symptoms that typically last less than a week, unless there is an involvement with other bacteria.

According to the clinical signs the visible onset of infection usually occurs three to four days after initial exposure, but when it is combined with other organisms—such as a combination parinfluenza-bordatella infection—the symptoms may last for up to three weeks.

Experts say in order to prevent this disease, it is recommended that you not expose your dog to kennel-like or boarding conditions, where large populations of dogs are contained and mixed together. However, we have learned that is not the only case. Just because you do not board your dog does not mean your neighbor or even someone down the street does not take their dog to a boarding kennel. Do you take your dog to a dog park, Petsmart or Petco, or any place other dogs go? Or do you just walk your dog down the street? Bordetella spreads just like the common cold and flu in humans and can turn into pneumonia if your dog's immune system is compromised in any way whether from stress or illness.

And yes, even humans can get it! Bordetella bronchiseptica-induced disease in humans is said to be an uncommon infection (since 1911, 65 cases have been reported) that generally produces a relatively non-threatening, "whooping cough" (normally caused by Bordetella pertussis)-like syndrome in immunocompetent individuals. However, B. bronchiseptica has also been associated with endocarditis, peritonitis, meningitis, and wound infections. In some cases, a direct connection to animals is obvious. It is not known how many cases go unreported.

Bottom line is, whether or not you take your dog to a boarding kennel, your dog should be vaccinated twice a year to prevent him or her from getting Bordetella.
